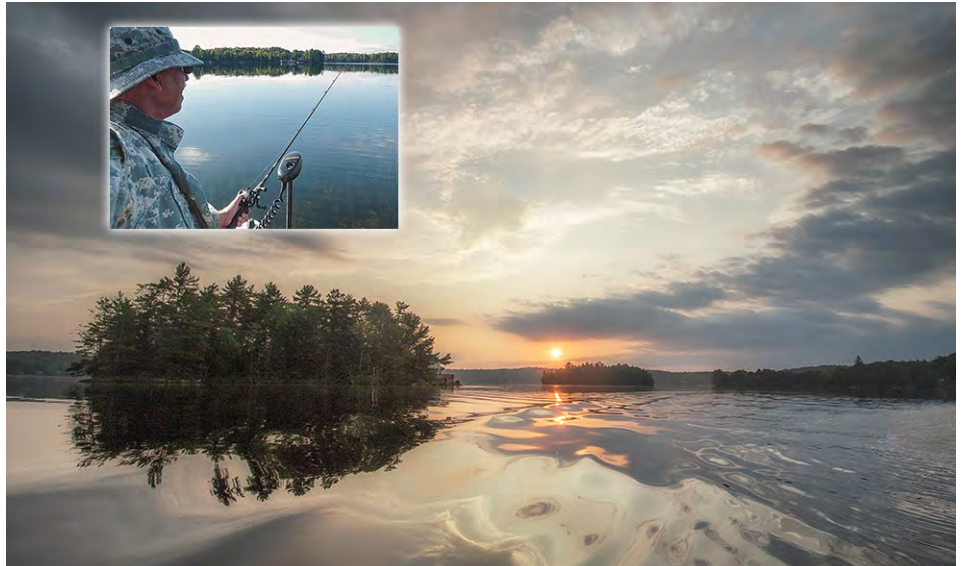
As I step down I will be focusing on spending more time on my family. I will not be far and hope to be able to be active at events and continue to support the lake and community in any way I can.

WLHCA Fall 2024 Newsletter Lake Steward's Report

As conveyed through the 2021 Love Your Lake survey, fishing is one of the most popular recreational activities on Wollaston Lake (as well as a draw for tourists to our township). Therefore, the WLHCA, in 2024, expanded our habitat protection focus from the shoreline (riparian zone) to include the spawning beds of the Lake Trout and Walleye fish species. These species are limited to spawning on small to medium sized rock aggregate locations with an abundance of dissolved oxygen, due to consistent wave action. We were successful in our application for inclusion in Watersheds Canada fish habitat improvement program which commenced with an assessment, by one of their experts, of the MNR identified spawning bed locations. The assessment recommended that the beds be cleaned/augmented with additional aggregate and that brush bundles be installed to provide hiding locations from predator species for the fry, after they hatch. Watersheds Canada were successful in funding the installation of 20 brush bundle in Wollaston Lake on September 23 and WLHCA is submitting an application to TD Bank Friends of the Environment, with support from the Wollaston Township council, to fund the additional recommended actions. A big thank you to all who volunteered and watch for information on additional initiatives



and opportunities to volunteer in this exciting area.

The 2024 season has also been a very busy and productive one for the WLHCA lake health initiatives. In addition to the many invasive species initiatives completed by the Milfoil Action Committee (MAC), expanded seasonal water quality

testing and a major Trillium grant application is in process of completion.

DFO Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Grant Application Status

The Wollaston Lake Home and Cottage Association (WLHCA)



successfully completed the submission of a lengthy grant application by the deadline of August 31, 2023. The national federal grant provides project funding for invasive species prevention and management, as well as species at risk habitat restoration for a maximum of three years with annual amounts not to exceed \$250,000 CDN. WLHCA's submission has been accepted as a valid application on the list of projects not currently funded.

The DFO confirmed that we put forward a strong grant application based on our track record of invasive species management over the last seven years, however, the number of valid projects far exceeds the federal funding that has currently been made available. We continue to monitor the status of this fund as to date, only two projects from The Invasive Species Centre of Ontario and the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (OFAH) have received funding in Ontario.

Water Quality Testing and Community Outreach

As first communicated in the spring 2022 newsletter, the just completed water quality testing season added water quality testing at additional points on the Wollaston Lake, watershed and other Township Lakes included in the water quality testing for the 2024 season. To be added to the program, additional water bodies need to provide a prime contact to be trained to conduct the future collection of water samples.

At the request of the Wollaston Township Chief Building Official (CBO), in support of the septic re-inspection program, three additional sites continue to be monitored on Wollaston Lake in addition to the previous four sites for a total of seven sampling sites. Some sampling results have been received from the labs and all findings will be presented in the Spring 2025 newsletter. The results received to

date indicate a continued increase in nutrient levels in response to the increase in single period rainfall events. I'm certain 2024 will be remembered for its severe flooding events in Toronto. The water levels in Wollaston Lake were higher than average even with the CVCA periodically removing some of the logs from the dam.

In the late spring of 2023, water quality restoration initiatives were commenced (at the request of a majority of the lake front property owners) on Urbach lake in consultation with the CVCA and the Trent Aquatic Research Program (TARP). A severe outbreak of filamentous algae on the lake (at times as much as 50% of the surface covered) has continued to be largely reversed over the summer of 2024.

The summer of 2025 will see a continued focus on fish species abundance and the health of Wollaston Township lakes. As always initiatives we undertake are subject to available funding, volunteer participation and approval of permits by the DFO and MNRF. A review of our DFO permit will be initiated by our request to expand the total area that can be harvested and addressed with benthic mats as well as a further review of potential for Procacclo FX as an additional tool based on the single site (Farlain Lake) Ontario application to date.

Municipal Update

Thanks to the 47% of Wollaston Lake property owners, who supported the Association this year with a new or renewed membership. You are the 120 of the 255 properties on the lake who are our rock.

Thanks to the Road Captains who do an important job of knocking on their neighbours' doors and encouraging everyone to participate. Beach Lane had the highest membership rate this year at 72% Well done Beach Lane!

The real estate market was slower again this year, with only 6 properties listed for sale, at the time of wiring this (September 23). This data is based on listings on Realtor.ca and may not include private sales that are not publicly listed.

Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held on Sunday August 11, at the Coe Hill Legion.

Fourteen member properties attended, with a total of 18 people. 6 of the 22 roads were present - Beach, Corral Post, Kendon, Lawrence, Maple Ridge, and Sherwin. Of the 4 Township Councilors who are eligible for membership, only 2 paid their membership in 2024, and only 1 attended the AGM. This is disappointing to our Association Membership who are a significant constituency of the township



property tax revenue and enjoy the opportunity to discuss issues.

The agenda for the meeting included reports from the Treasurer, Membership, Lake Steward, Milfoil Action Committee and Events.

By vote at the meeting, the annual membership fee will increase by \$5 in 2025, to \$40.

CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY your watercraft's or we will have bigger problems than E. Milfoil in Wollaston Lake!!! Be on the lookout for these...



Starry Stonewort (SSW) in Stoney Lake and Trent-Severn Waterway Macroalgae, thin stems/branchlets

similar to thick fishing line, white, star-shaped bulbils at the nodes, 3-6 mm wide and can reach heights up to 10 meters in the water column. Reproduce by transfer of small fragments.* "Pillows" of SSW can restrict recreational activities entirely!



Water Soldier in the Trent River
 Long, thin, serrated leaves in a rosette

formation, flowers rise above the plant, have three white/green sepals and three white petals. Water Soldier can be submerged up to 5 m but floats to the surface in summer. This poses a threat to summer recreational activities such as fishing, boating, and swimming. Boat motors can break up plants allowing them to spread and invade new areas.

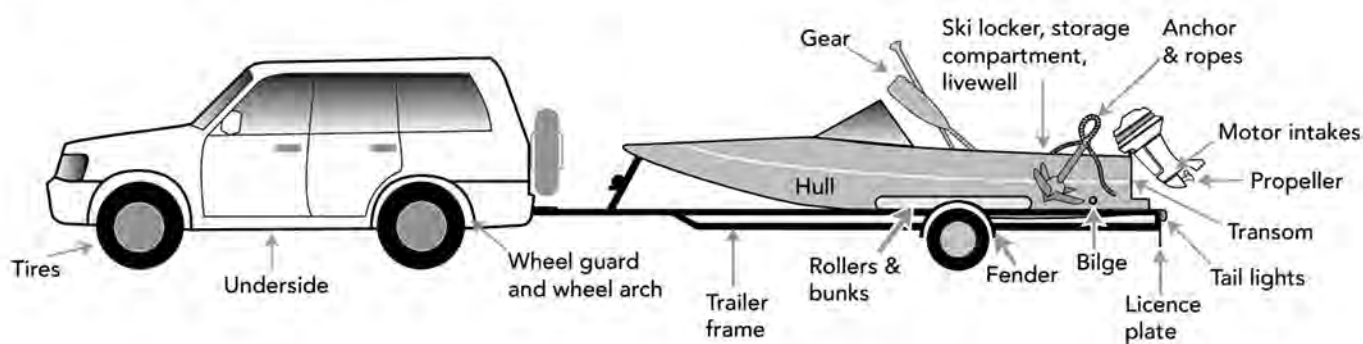


Spiny Water Flea found in all of the Great Lakes and smaller lakes in

Ontario. Spiny Water Fleas is an invasive zooplankton that form large, jelly-like masses that can spread to other water bodies on commercial and recreational fishing equipment. The Spiny

Water Flea out competes native species for food, which can have cascading impacts to the entire food web.

- Movies (for those chilly nights). We have a great selection of DVDs, and also partner with other libraries in a DVD pool that brings in 100 fresh movies every three months.

- Puzzles (for those long winter days). Borrow one and snuggle in with family members to put one together.
- Internet access (to stay connected). Use one of our computers or bring your own for free access

(even when the Library is closed – the password is on the door).

- And programs for kids aren't limited to the summer months! We will be offering crafts for kids on P.A. Days at the Library. Upcoming dates are November 22, January 31 and March 31. Save the dates!

Not a member yet? No problem. See Kelly to register for free; just show ID or proof of a Wollaston address. And speaking of "free", using the Library costs nothing (though there is a small charge for some services, like printing or copying).

The Library is a warm and welcoming place. We hope to see you there in the cold months!

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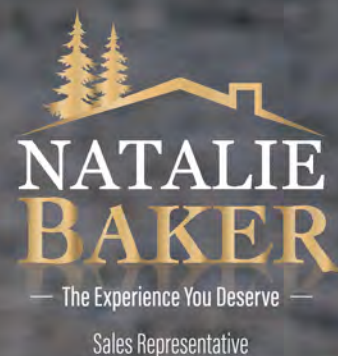
